


A POWERFUL DRIVER FOR SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT IN THE CARIBBEAN

With an innovative and cross-cutting approach, Transcultura considers culture and creativity to be transformative and resilient forces in all their expressions: tangible and intangible cultural heritage, cultural and creative industries, and cultural tourism. The programme aims to professionalize the cultural and creative sector in the Caribbean, and to create opportunities for entrepreneurship and access to markets.














TRANSCULTURA IN BRIEF

- A 5-year programme (2020 to 2024)
 - 17 beneficiary countries
- · 3,000 targeted beneficiaries, out of which 50% women
- 3 languages of implementation: English, French, Spanish • 15 million euros in European Union funding
 - 4 UNESCO Offices involved:
 - Havana, Kingston, Port-au-Prince and Brussels
 - · An inter-sectoral approach: culture, education, social and human sciences, communication
- · Cross-cutting themes: youth, digital transformation, gender equality, human rights, Small Island Developing States (SIDS)

WHO IS IT AIMED AT?

Transcultura is aimed at young artists and professionals in the cultural and creative sector, between the ages of 18 and 35, from the 17 Member States of the Caribbean Community (CARICOM). the Caribbean Forum (CARIFORUM) and the Organisation of Eastern Caribbean States (OECS). The selection of beneficiaries takes into account gender parity (50%) as well as geographical representation criteria.

CULTURAL TRAINING

- Creation of a Caribbean Cultural Training Hub
- Online and face-to-face courses in English, Spanish and French
- Scholarships for access to training
- Production of free massive, open and online courses (MOOCs), in English, Spanish and French
- Heritage rehabilitation of the Santa Clara Convent in Havana, and upgrade of equipment of the institutions responsible for delivering the courses

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


