## PROVISIONAL PROGRAMME

"UNESCO will engage youth in leading dynamic heritage preservation projects and in volunteering in awareness-raising in this field as a vector of dialogue and inclusion".

As a follow up to the 2012 International Conference of NGOs in official partnership with UNESCO, the NGO-UNESCO Liaison Committee, in cooperation with the UNESCO Secretariat, have chosen to dedicate one of the Forums of the biennium 2013-2014 - the third of its kind - to the role of youth for the safeguarding of tangible cultural heritage and of intangible cultural heritage.

Concerning the tangible cultural heritage, we know how important and popular are the restoration projects, the engagement of young people around World Heritage sites (cultural and natural) and their contribution to valorising built heritage, notably in the processes of informal education and non-formal education.

Concerning the intangible cultural heritage (ICH - 2003 Convention for the Safeguarding of Intangible Cultural Heritage), the holders of ICH elements are at the heart of, and are the main actors in the processes of safeguarding (inventories, communication, education, safeguarding, promotion, etc.) whether those are implemented by public bodies, by NGOs or informal civil society organisations (festivals, meetings, research, entertainment, etc.). It is by focusing the safeguarding policies notably towards young holders of elements of ICH, that the objectives of these policies will be essentially achieved.

For one form of heritage or for the other - which incidentally are often intertwined - young people generally engage through NGOs. Many NGOs, official partners of UNESCO, in the areas of culture evidently, but in education and communication too, are active in programs or projects dealing with safeguarding heritage.

During two days of discussions and workshops in Sozopol, the Forum will review the different types of youth participation in heritage safeguarding, sharing experiences in particular on the difficulties faced by NGOs in this area, and seek ways to encourage support in working on safeguarding with youth.

The four topics to be considered during the Forum will be the following:

- 1. How to build capacity (in formal and informal education) for young people in safeguarding cultural heritage?
- 2. Which initiatives, public and private, are needed to include young people in the safeguarding of cultural heritage and awareness-raising?
- 3. How to promote cultural diversity and to improve intercultural dialogue through the safeguarding of cultural heritage?
- 4. How to create jobs/livelihoods through cultural heritage safeguarding and contribute to sustainable development?

A wide participation of young people in the Forum is sought. The conclusions of the Forum will be transmitted to all NGOs in official partnership and to the Director-General of UNESCO, so as to contribute a special focus and some possible enrichment in the safeguarding of cultural heritage. The Forum is also expected to feed the current debate on the definition of the post 2015 Development Agenda.
