# UNESCO Prize for Girls' and Women's Education

## Call for nominations 2018

**Deadline: 11 May 2018**

The UNESCO Prize for Girls' and Women's Education honours outstanding and innovative practices advancing **girls' and women's education**, and in turn, improving the quality of their lives. Established in 2015, it is funded by the Government of the People's Republic of China and consists of two US \$50,000 awards to help further the work of laureates in this field. The Prize directly contributes to Sustainable Development Goals 4 and 5.

## Who can nominate?

**Governments of UNESCO Member States** via their National Commissions and Permanent Delegations to UNESCO, and Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs) in official partnership with UNESCO can make **up to 3 nominations**.

Self-nominations are not accepted.

## Who can be nominated?

**Individuals, institutions or organizations** having made an outstanding contribution to the advancement of girls' and women's education. Nominations must focus on an **established and ongoing** project or programme of the nominee, which has been running for at least two years. **before 11 May 2018 (midnight, Paris time).**
